(c) Submarine probable - Patrol plane, with running lights blinking passed on port side of ship and dropped flare astern. Position approximately 38°58' N. and 72°25' W. Visibility approximately 1000 yds. or less. Time - 2120. At time of incident ship was zigzaging and Condition II on watch. Flank speed was called for and stern put to. Upon reaching bridge either a flare of great brillance or a ship aflame was observed on the horizon. Second flare was dropped by plane and Master and Gunnery Officer saw unidentified object in area of illumination on port quarter. Opened fire with stern gun, 5"/38. Range set at 3200 yds. Spotted first shot as short about 200 or 300 yds. Second shot could not be observed as flare had settled in the sea. Two (2) rounds expended. No further firing. Ten minutes later two (2) more flares were dropped but were too far astern and nearly out of visibility by the bridge on the ship.
